### **5. Update from the Friends of the Library and the Library Foundation**

Glaisner stated that Joan Tarachow is moving to Madison and will be missed. A send-off was held after the last Friends meeting. A book sale is tentatively planned for fall, however the ongoing book sales are going strong and bringing in over \$1000/month. The book sale is a huge undertaking, and current book sale revenues are going well. Glaisner reported on behalf of the Foundation stating that the capital fundraising has been in deep discussion with co-chairs Marianne Lubar and Bud Selig. The campaign is in a bit of a limbo at the moment, but he stated that answers may be possible next week. Gould will write a letter of introduction for the campaign materials package, and Jim Radford from Baker Street Consulting has also been asked to write a letter.
